The Quiet Way of Holiness with Mary, Our Mother

The way of Mary is one of faith and quiet confidence in the Lord. The Scriptures tell of little of Mary's daily life, which remains largely hidden. But they do relate how she acted in "crisis" situations: when she was asked to be the Mother of God at the Annunciation; when the couple ran out of wine at the Wedding at Cana; when she stood at the foot of the Cross.

In every moment of crisis, she did not run away, but stood her ground, placing every confidence in God. Bewildered by Gabriel's announcement that she was chosen to be the Mother of God, she did not hesitate to consent, entrusting herself to God's providential will for her. Quick to discern the young couple's predicament at the wedding feast, she immediately approached her Son, certain of a favorable reply. Pierced by anguish as she stood beneath the Cross, at her Son's behest she embraced the apostle John and the disciples of all time and places as her own dear children.

It is the great privilege of sodalists to walk this Marian way with Mary, showing forth the same faith and quiet confidence of the Mother of God. In imitation of Mary, their lives remain hidden in Christ, always ready to respond to the promptings and demands of divine grace. Assisted by Mary, they embrace their vocation to be bearers of Christ to the world, bringing the needs of their neighbors to his attention through prayer, and standing close in solidarity with all who suffer.

I give thanks to God for all of you, the members of the Sodality of Our Lady of St. Hugh of Grenoble parish, who walk the quiet way of holiness with Mary. May you always know the consolation of her maternal care, and may she strengthen you in every need.
